Service Overview: Survivorship Education, Support, Resources, Public Awareness

Our services and resources serve people being tested, treated, or monitored for any type of thyroid cancer, as well as their caregivers and friends, health care professionals, and the public. Our numerous free services are made possible by ThyCa volunteers, staff, and in-kind and financial donations. Funding comes from membership dues, individual donations, and unrestricted operating grants. Among 2019 accomplishments:

Web Site, www.thyca.org. Our comprehensive web site explains all types of thyroid cancer and has materials in numerous languages. More than 75 leading thyroid cancer specialist physicians provide ongoing input and review.

Free Handbooks. Our free handbooks combine the efforts of physicians, patients, and caregivers. The handbooks are free for download in both PDF and ePub formats, and in print by mail to individuals and physicians to give to their patients. We distributed thousands of copies during 2019.

- **Thyroid Cancer Basics** covers all types of thyroid cancer. It's available in English, Arabic, Chinese, Hebrew, Italian, Russian, and Spanish.
- **Anaplastic Thyroid Cancer Handbook** offers key information about the rarest and most aggressive thyroid cancer. Available in English, Chinese, and Spanish.
- **Medullary Thyroid Cancer Handbook** explains both sporadic and hereditary medullary thyroid cancer. It's available in English, Chinese, and Spanish.
- **Thyroid Nodules: Testing and Follow-Up Handbook** explains both benign and malignant thyroid nodules. It's available in English and Arabic.

Patient Information Packets. We filled requests for thousands of free Patient Information Packets worldwide.

Free Low-Iodine Diet Information: The 8th Edition of our acclaimed free Low Iodine Cookbook is available. Medical advisors and research dietitians provided input and review. Cookbooks are available in English, French, Portuguese, and Spanish. We also make available for download a 1-page Low Iodine Diet Guidelines in English, Japanese, and Spanish.

ThyCa Newsletter. Our free weekly online newsletter went to over 120,000 recipients in over 130 countries.

Online Support Groups. ThyCa's email support groups and Inspire online community grew to more than 70,000 participants. Our group support began in 1995 with the world's first thyroid cancer support group.

Local In-Person Support Groups. More than 130 groups in 9 countries provide valuable face-to-face support.

One-to-One Support. Our Toll-Free Number Team, Email Response Team, Person-To-Person Network (matches people with the same thyroid cancer type), gave 1-to-1 service to over 10,000 individuals and organizations this year.

Videos. Our YouTube channel has over 70 videos with physicians, patients, and a caregiver.

Free Guestbook and Newsletter Subscriptions.

Through our Guestbook, website visitors subscribe to our free online newsletter and email announcements.

Outreach. We provided more than 150,000 free brochures and other materials to physicians, hospitals, individuals, and community groups in 2019.

Thyroid Cancer Awareness Month. ThyCa sponsors Worldwide Thyroid Cancer Awareness Month each September. Our web site gives details plus free tools and tips. Individuals and organizations again partnered.

#TruthsAboutTC Campaign. ThyCa collaborated with Light of Life Foundation and Eisai, Inc. in the 5th year of this multimedia campaign to raise awareness.

Workshops and Seminars. ThyCa support groups sponsored dozens of free seminars with physician speakers. ThyCa also sponsored free one-day Regional Workshops in Maryland, and New York.

Annual International Conference. Our 22nd Annual International Thyroid Cancer Survivors' Conference in Denver, Colorado, drew people from around the United States and other countries. The 23rd International Conference will take place in Los Angeles, California, on October 23-25, 2020.


Pediatric Backpacks. The free backpacks sent to children, teens, and their families are filled with information and ThyCa Awareness items.

Meetings and Exhibits. ThyCa took part in more than 30 professional meetings, seminars, and community health fairs in 2019. Our reason for participating is to raise awareness about thyroid cancer as well as ThyCa's many programs and services.

NORD Support. ThyCa participated in publicizing Rare Diseases Day, an important awareness observance of the National Organization for Rare Disorders (NORD).

Research Fundraising and Grants

ThyCa began fundraising for thyroid cancer research in 2001 to expand urgently needed thyroid cancer research. In 2003 we proudly awarded the first-ever patient-funded Thyroid Cancer Research Grant. Since then, we have awarded 84 grants to researchers in 7 countries, totaling more than \$2.3 million.

We welcome contributions of any size to our Thyroid Cancer Research Fund for research on papillary, follicular, variants, and anaplastic thyroid cancer and to our Medullary Thyroid Cancer Research Fund.

Thanks to continuing growth in donations, ThyCa awarded nine scientific and clinical research grants in 2019. Experts from the American Thyroid Association and American Association of Endocrine Surgeons reviewed applications and selected recipients. Our website has details. We plan to award more grants in 2020. One grant is the Ric Blake Memorial Thyroid Cancer Research Grant in memory and honor of ThyCa Co-Founder Ric Blake.

Thyroid cancer survivors, loved ones, and medical professionals have all joined together in varied ways to raise funds and awareness.

What we are doing ensures that no one with thyroid cancer diagnosed in the future will feel as alone or unaware of thyroid cancer as we did.

We are most grateful to everyone who donates to ThyCa.

We thank the many volunteers who initiated highly successful individual fundraisers during the year. These included the Strokes for Hope Golf Tournament, fitness center events, a hike, countless birthday celebrations, and more. In addition, our 18th Annual Benefit Dinner/Auction was an inspiring evening of tribute and support. The consistent theme is that each donation makes a difference.

Through these wonderful efforts, we hope that the future will bring cures for all thyroid cancer.
