

Top 9 things to know about Thyroid Cancer

1. Thyroid cancer affects people of all ages, from young children to seniors.
2. Both women and men get thyroid cancer — more than two-thirds of the people with thyroid cancer are women.
3. Thyroid cancer has many types and variants, with treatment tailored to the type and individual.
4. When found early, thyroid cancer is usually treatable.
5. Even when treatable, thyroid cancer is life-disrupting, expensive, and stressful for patients and loved ones.
6. A simple Neck Check done by a medical professional during a routine appointment can detect a thyroid nodule.
7. Most thyroid nodules are benign, not cancer.
8. However, some thyroid cancers are aggressive and difficult to treat.
